THE EXPERIMENT ON KINSTON'S KIDS

- A University of North Carolina dentist's experiment will give fluoride to infants, a chemical shown in dozens of recent studies to lower IQ. Parents are not being warned of the risks.
- The 4-year experiment, named "waterBEST", seeks to enroll babies as young as 2 months. The study is supposed to test whether fluoridated water can reduce tooth decay, yet the study's summary admits any benefit is "uncertain".
- National Institute for Health guidelines for human experiments require risks don't outweigh benefits, yet UNC allowed this study to go forward.

JUST LIKE LEAD, FLUORIDE HARMS BRAINS



Over 70 studies find fluoride reduces IQ or increases risk of ADHD, many at dose levels of the Kinston experiment.



Internationally-known scientists say fluoride is equivalent to lead in lowering IQ.



The National Research Council also links fluoride to kidney disease, diabetes, thyroid disease, and dental fluorosis.
